

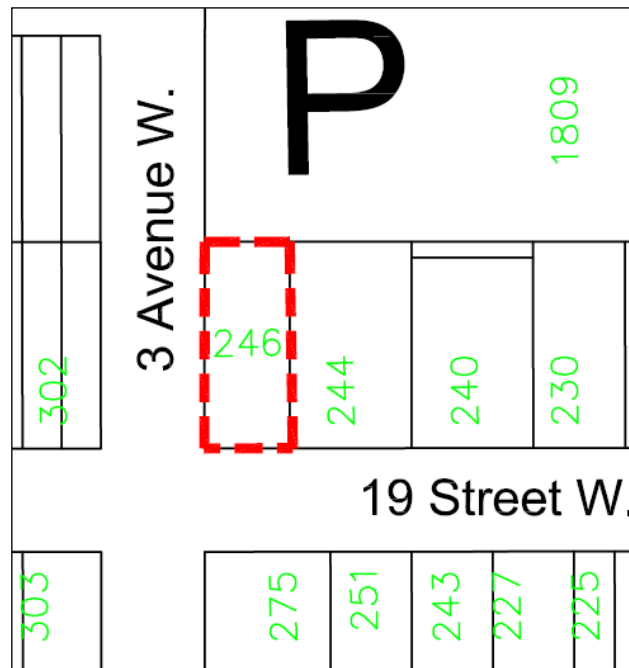
**Notice of Intention to Designate  
MUNICIPAL HERITAGE PROPERTY**

Public notice is hereby given, pursuant to Section 11(2) of The Heritage Property Act, that the Council of The City of Prince Albert intends to designate the following property as a Municipal Heritage Property:

**Civic Address: 246 – 19<sup>th</sup> Street West**

**Legal Description: Lot 44, Block 16, Plan 00PA02935**

**Present Use: Public/Quasi-Public Building (Museum)**



**PROPOSED BYLAW:** The Council of the City of Prince Albert will consider Bylaw No. 16 of 2014, being a bylaw to designate the above property as a Municipal Heritage Property, at its meeting to be held at 5:00 pm, Monday, June 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2014.

**REASON:** The Museum and Heritage Advisory Committee has requested the Municipal Heritage Property designation for the subject site to ensure its long-term preservation. The subject property is currently owned by the City of Prince Albert, having been donated by John and Olive Diefenbaker in 1975. The building was opened to the public as a museum in 1983 and operated by the Prince Albert Historical Society. The subject site was the primary residence of former Prime Minister John Diefenbaker from 1947 – 1957. The subject site is features a single detached home, initially constructed in 1912. The designation will identify the property as being of historical and architectural significance.

**WRITTEN OBJECTION:** Any person may file a written objection to the proposed designation in the office of the City Clerk (City Hall, 1084 Central Avenue, Prince Albert, S6V 7P3) no later than 4:00 p.m., Tuesday, June 17<sup>th</sup>, 2014.
