

CITY OF PRINCE ALBERT PUBLIC NOTICE

PORTABLE SIGN BYLAW - BYLAW NO. 19 OF 2018

Public Notice is hereby given that the Council of the City of Prince Albert intends to consider Bylaw No. 19 of 2018 to repeal Bylaw No. 22 of 2010, known as the City of Prince Albert Portable Sign Bylaw.

Reason for the Amendment:

Bylaw No. 19 of 2018 proposes the following changes:

- Adding "Signs cannot be placed on public property. This includes boulevards curb-side trees, street light standards, public signage, public mailboxes and intersections, with the exception of election signs."
- A new section on advertising content has been added to ensure any text on portable signs
 follows the Canadian Code of Advertising Standards and does not advertise any text that is
 demeaning or derogatory.
- The minimum distance between portable signs has been changed from 20 meters to 10 meters to allow for more signage on a one side.

Therefore, City Council, at its meeting to be held on November 13, 2018 at 5:00 p.m., will consider submissions respecting the above application. In accordance with City Council's Procedure Bylaw No. 26 of 2014, all submissions must be provided to the City Clerk. If you would like your submission reviewed by City Council PRIOR to the meeting, it would be preferable to provide your submission by 4:45 p.m. on Tuesday November 6, 2018.
