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## General Requirements

## Commercial \& Industrial Zoning Districts

## Commercial -C3 \& C4 Zoning Districts

Fences in the C3 and C4 zoning districts are allowed to have a fence in the front, side and rear yard that is 3.66 m (12') in height.


## Industrial Zoning Districts

Fences in industrial zoning districts are allowed to have a fence in the front, side and rear yard that is 3.66 m (12') in height. Fences in the front yard may be required to be constructed of chain link.


## Residential \& Commercial Zoning Districts

## General Requirements cont'd

## Residential Zoning Districts

Fences in residential zoning districts and RMU zoning district are allowed to have a fence in the front, side and rear yard. The maximum fence height for the front yard is $1.2 \mathrm{~m}\left(4^{\prime}\right)$. The maximum height for the side and rear yard is $1.9 \mathrm{~m}\left(6^{\prime} 2^{\prime \prime}\right)$ in height.


## Commercial -C1, C2 \& CMU Zoning Districts

Fences in the $\mathrm{C} 1, \mathrm{C} 2$ and CMU zoning districts are allowed to have a fence in the front, side and rear yard that is $2.44 \mathrm{~m}\left(8^{\prime}\right)$ in height.

All contractors and landowners must contact Sask 1st Call from a land line 1-866-828-4888, \#4888 from cell phone or online at www.sask1stcall.com before excavating or digging holes.

Sask 1st Call issues a line locate request notification to subscriber companies to ensure their underground utilities in the area are clearly marked.

This service is currently provided free of charge.

## Locating Your Property Lines

It is the owners responsibility to:

- Contact Information Services Corporation (ISC) and utility companies to locate utility lines and easements. Construction over underground utilities is not permitted.
- Determine where property lines are located. Property lines can typically be obtained through a Surveyors Certificate or Real Property Report from a legal land surveyor.
